1. Start reviewing and prepping - Sample quiz along with application form.
2. Get yellow stickies or something to tab your workbook you'll receive.
3. DO THIS One NOW - Get a scientific calculator (a business calculator is NOT recommended) - You need to get it now and Practice. We will be doing problems on the first day right out of the gate, while I can explain most calculator issues in key strokes - it does take up time. A good calculator is something in the \$15 -20 range. Something in the TI 30, 30x, 35, 35x range will do just fine. The small desk calculators and phone calculators will not be effective and are not recommended - I Can't stress this enough to get it NOW and practice.
